# Setting up your quiz

## 1. Choose a date and venue

Think about pubs, social clubs or at work.

## 2. Get people involved

Make sure to send out invites in plenty of time.. You could set up a Facebook event to invite friends, family and colleagues and keep people posted with updates.

## 3. Sell tickets

This is an easy way to fundraise. Ask teams to pay a team donation or ask each team member to donate. If you have 10 teams of 5 and each person donates a fiver you'll have already raised an incredible £250!

## 4. Secure prizes

Get in touch with local businesses to see if they will support your fundraiser by donating a prize for your quiz. If you need a letter of authorisation when approaching businesses, please get in touch with us.

## 5. Decide your quiz rounds

You can pick and choose which questions and categories you would like to use from this toolkit, as well as add in your own questions.

## Extra rounds and fundraising tips

### Lightning Round

For every question a team gets right they earn two points but if they get even one question wrong in this round they don't get any points. So guess wisely!

### Picture Round

Put together a series of pictures for teams to guess, such as guessing the celebrity as a child, character names or sporting heroes.

### Cheater's Penalty

Tell teams if they are caught using their phones to look up answers they need to make an extra donation!

### Loose Change

Ask players to donate their change if have bought drinks at the bar.

### Heads or Tails

This is a great game to play between rounds. Ask players to donate £1 to take part. Get the players to stand up and ask them to choose 'heads' (and point to their head) or 'tails' (and point to their bottom). The Quizmaster should toss a coin and call out the result. Anyone who guessed the correct side should remain standing and all those incorrect should sit down. This should continue until you only have one player standing, with a prize for the winner!
